he Mt. Lebanon School
District is taking action
to plan for the current
and future revenue needs
of our schools with a campaign.
The goal is to provide a
sustainable future for the
District so that we can continue
to meet the high standards
of educational excellence that
Mt. Lebanon is known for,
our students require for future
success, and the community
expects.





Our goal is to raise \$3 million to build an endowment and \$3 million to strengthen our programs including fine arts, athletics and academics K-12. To date, we have raised about 25% of our goal from a number of our early supporters. We are on our way, but we want to build a broader base of support.

State funding for public schools has remained flat, at times uncertain, and has not kept pace with the rising costs of education, creating the need for Mt. Lebanon School District to rely more on local tax dollars. Raising private

money to support public education is the new reality of school funding. Mt. Lebanon School District is undertaking this initiative to maintain exceptional schools that develop well-rounded students.

Campaign will help give our school leaders additional resources to invest in academic programming. And also help secure our ongoing commitment to the fine and performing arts programs, athletics, and student life.





REIMAGINING OUR ELEMENTARY LIBRARIES

Thanks to our Dare to Dream: Reimagining Our Elementary Libraries initiative we have an opportunity to enhance the Mt. Lebanon School District elementary libraries. Mt. Lebanon parents and alumni David ('75) and Noelle ('78) Conover made a gift of \$175,000 (\$25,000 for each elementary school) to help us make this vision a reality for our libraries. This generous gift is the initial funding to create a *Matt's Maker Space* in each elementary library. Named after their son Matt, who lost a courageous battle with cancer in 2002, we thank the Conover family with our deepest gratitude for their generosity and support of our schools and we invite our community to become involved in this initiative.

Our elementary principals will convene committees in their schools to share the vision for their particular library. If you are interested in participating, please contact your building principal.



CAMPAIGN SUCCESS

Thanks to the generous support from our donors, we have been able to allocate \$100,000 to fund equipment for high school fine arts thanks to a donor designated gift as well as \$50,000 to purchase equipment for the technology education department and \$50,000 for elementary technology, as recommended by faculty, district administrators and the Capital Campaign Philanthropic Advisory Panel.

These enhancements would not be possible at this time without the support of our donors.
