

OPPOSITION TO APPLICATION FOR MALT BEVERAGE AND LIQUOR LICENSES WITHIN 300 FEET OF SCHOOLS

Background

The Pennsylvania Legislature has enabled school districts to protest the issuance of malt beverage and liquor licenses within close proximity to schools. The Mt. Lebanon School Board historically has elected to object to the issuance of malt beverage and liquor license to premises located within 300 feet of school property and has consistently filed objections to such licenses since 1954.

Policy

In accordance with the policy of the Pennsylvania Legislature to discourage the granting of malt beverage and liquor licenses to premises located in the vicinity of schools, it is the policy of the Mt. Lebanon School District to object to the granting of malt beverage and/or liquor licenses to any premises located within 300 feet of school property.

School Board Responsibility

The Board President will respond to such applications with the applicable regulatory authorities according to this policy unless the Board takes public action to exempt a specific application from this policy.

Administrative Responsibility

It shall be the responsibility of the Administration to implement and enforce this policy, and to develop Administrative Procedures for implementation and enforcement where necessary.
