It was moved by Ellwein and seconded by Fleisher that the Board approves the minutes of the Policy Committee Meeting held on April 11, 2022; the Discussion Meeting held on April 11, 2022; the Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Committee Meeting held on April 19, 2022; and the Regular Meeting held on April, 2022.

STUDENT COUNCIL REPORTS

Jefferson Middle School students Olivia Meyer and Jacquelyn Tang updated the Board on the final totals from their week-long Pop Tab War. The student body raised \$1,530.55 to donate to the USA for the United Nations High Commissioners Association, which will benefit Ukrainian refugees.

Wish Week also took place. The Wish Week Committee was able to grant 262 wishes, including opportunities to teach a class, receive candy and fruit, become royalty for a day, and follow the schedule of a best friend.

Student Council members were rewarded with a trip to a Pirate's Game at PNC Park and a spirit week was held.

Ms. Tang also thanked JMS student council committee chairs for their hard work and commended student council members for accomplishing their goals this school year.

High School students Tori Pecarchik and Swap Rana spoke before the Board about end of year activities. Executive Council members for the 2022-2023 were sworn in, the art show, Spring Fling, Senior Reception, and spring performances have all been successful. Awards presentations, Keystone testing, and appreciation days have been keeping students busy. Boys baseball is competing in WPIAL quarter finals, boys and girls lacrosse are also competing in WPIAL semi finals. Mt. Lebanon Track and Field will be represented by Caroline Adams and Megan Cain at state finals. Senior Prom will be held on Thursday, May 26. Commencement will be held on Wednesday, June 1.

BOARD PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Mr. Wyland began by recognizing Dr. Marybeth Irvin, who was named the 2022 recipient of TheWomen's Caucus - Margaret Smith Award by The Pennsylvania Association of School Administrators Women's Caucus. The Margaret Smith Leadership Award is given to a female administrator who has demonstrated proven leadership in education.

Two Mellon Middle School Students were recognized as Promising Young Writers by the National Council of English Teachers. Caroline King and Anna Bailey were presented with certificates of recognition by the Board.

Mr. Wyland concluded by thanking Mr. Geletko and the business office staff for their hard work and dedication in creation of the 2022-2023 budget.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Dr. Steinhauer presented certificates of appreciation to District retirees. Each of the 31 retirees was individually acknowledged and thanked for their years of service to the District.

As part of the Superintendent goals, a special education program review was conducted. Dr. Heather Doyle presented highlights of the review.

BOARD REPORTS

<u>Policy Committee</u> - Ms. Olbrich reported that policy BEDH, Public Participation at Board Meetings, was reviewed at the last Policy Committee meeting. The committee concluded that more information is necessary before moving the policy forward to the rest of the Board.

<u>PSBA/NSBA</u> - Mr. Ellwein noted that legislation regarding the accuracy of charter school payment is being introduced by Senator Gene Yaw.

<u>MLFE</u> - Mrs. Gentzel reported that a successful pickleball tournament fundraiser was held and the foundation met to discuss how to improve the tournament for next year as well as ideas for additional fundraisers.

<u>Municipal Liaison</u> - Dr. Hackett reported that a climate resolution was passed with a pledge to be off of fossil fuels by 2050 and to move toward the use of electric vehicles. Mt. Lebanon Police Department Chief Aaron Lauth has retired. The process to identify Chief Lauth's replacement has begun. The Community Relations Board has been modified and new DEI members have been added to the Board.

<u>Parkway West Career and Technical Center</u> - Ms. Johnson reported a graduation ceremony was held on May 18. It was a very impressive event.

<u>Pathfinder School</u> - Ms. Fleisher reported that the Pathfinder Board met on May 18. The administrative budget will be discussed and voted on at this evening's meeting.

<u>Diversity, Equity, & Inclusion</u> - Mr. Freeman reported that the DEI committee met prior to tonight's regular Board meeting. Progress toward goals and objectives continue to be reviewed with special focus on the DEI implementation plan. Two forums were held on May 19 to explore changes to District communications from a DEI perspective.
